#### A letter from the diocesan Cafod director

Dear Father and parishioners,

Thank you for your support this year, be it through our Lent or Harvest Fast Days, campaigning or remembering our brothers and sisters in prayer. We know that it means so much to them and to our partners.

I hope in these difficult times the resources shared below support you and the community in your preparations during the season of Advent.

We know that it has been a difficult time for our churches, and we are truly grateful that you did not forget our brothers and sisters across the world. During Harvest Fast Day, the Catholic community of England and Wales reached out to give and pray in so many incredible, different ways.

The need this year has been huge and challenging across the world. But thanks to you we have been able to continue our international work. Through CAFOD you have supported some of poorest communities most impacted by the virus. You have reached people in more than 33 countries, with over six million people receiving health and prevention advice and more than half a million people receiving safe hygiene supplies and services to prevent and reduce infection. Many more poor and vulnerable families have been supported with food supplies when there was no way to earn a living in the face of lockdown.

Your care for others meant that we were able to continue support in countries like Yemen, Syria, Sudan, Democratic Republic of Congo, Brazil where communities were already facing the toughest of challenges before the arrival of the virus.

Please do pass on this information to your parishioners, with our heartfelt thanks. Kayode Akintola, who works for CAFOD in Sierra Leone, West Africa, recorded a <u>message of thanks</u> for all of our supporters, which you might like to view or share in your newsletter, on your parish website or via social media.

We have a variety of Advent resources and prayer for your use with your parish. These include Advent prayer cards (one for each week), a series of day by day Advent reflections, online prayer events, an online carol service guide with a carol sheet, a chance to join or organise a fun run and other social events and more. #### **Christmas Masses**

As things stand, it looks as though we will still have the same limitations on the Christmas Masses as we have at the moment.

This means that:

We will be limited to 50 people at each Mass.

Masses will need to be kept short and simple.

We will not be allowed to sing. Sorry, no joining in with Carols.

Christmas Masses are going to feel very different, sadly.

We expect all Christmas Masses to be fully booked before Christmas.

People just turning up at the door without reserved places could make life difficult for the stewards who would have the unpleasant duty to turn people away.

We do not want to put them in this situation.

So please, Do not turn up for a Christmas Mass if you have not booked a place.

Booking is available immediately because I believe that the opportunity to come to Mass at Christmas should be first made available to you, the people who are 'sticking with us' through the year, either in church or through the newsletters, the website and the streamed Masses, as a priority before opening it to others.

We will have seven Christmas Masses, between Christmas Eve and the Sunday after Christmas. All of these Masses will essentially be the same Christmas Mass, whichever day you come. The booking is now open and the links are below and now live.

- 1. Please only book for one of these Masses at this stage to give more people the opportunity to come to Mass at Christmas.
- 2. **If you are able to print your ticket please print it and bring it**. This will make things easier for the stewards.
- 3. Please book the **correct number** of places that you want. Bookings are limited to six people.
- 4. If you book and then find you cannot attend, please cancel your booking which will free the place(s) for someone else.
- 5. If your choice of Mass is 'full', check back later, there may have been a cancellation.
