

WANTED

The SVP is collecting:

- ◆ **New underwear / socks for adults and children**
- ◆ **Toiletries / soap / toothpaste / sanitary products / disposable nappies**
- ◆ **Clothing (in a good, clean condition) for adults and children including coats, cardigans and jumpers**
- ◆ **Baby blankets and clothes**
- ◆ **Children's toys (in a good, clean condition)**
- ◆ **Bedding, curtains**
- ◆ **Activity packs such as crayons, colouring books, pens, paper**
