Re-opening of churches for Private Prayer

We hope that we will soon be able to open Sacred Heart church for private prayer. This church has been chosen as one of a number of pilot projects in the diocese to see how things go before extending the opening of churches to other churches.

This means that we have to get it right. One of the preparations we have to make is to have a number of volunteers so that there can always be two volunteers staffing the church at any time it is open. Their job will be to advise visitors on the system of social distancing in operation and to wipe down areas after they have been used.
