A local consultation for St. John Southworth and Good Shepherd parishes.

Ten years ago the parish of the Good Shepherd was formed consisting of Colne, Barrowford, Trawden, Foulridge, Barley, Roughlee, the surrounding areas and part of Nelson.

Prior to this there had been a consultation about the re-organisation of the parishes in this part of Pendle. The outcome was that part of Nelson which had been Holy Saviour's parish was combined with the former parishes of Sacred Heart and St. Peter and Paul's to create the new parish of the Good Shepherd.

There had been a discussion about whether to unite Holy Saviour's to the Colne and Barrowford parish or to unite it to the Nelson (and former Brierfield) parish.

The decision to split Nelson was not to everyone's liking. In recognition of this, when the new parish of the Good Shepherd was created a note was attached to say that it might be appropriate, at some time in the future, to review the Good Shepherd's boundary in Nelson.

At the beginning of 2017 there was a major review of the parish structures in the diocese and again the question of having the whole of Nelson united as one parish, along with Brierfield and Fence was raised.

In the last ten years a great deal has changed. The Catholic population of the area has changed and in common with most other areas, the size of Mass going congregations has reduced quite dramatically, even before Covid.

Two years ago, just before Covid came on the scene, Fr. Gerard and myself wrote a joint letter indicating that at that time there were five Catholic Churches in the area with six 'Sunday' Masses and fewer than 500 in the combined congregations. We indicated that because of this and the fact that the three churches in Nelson were within half a mile of each other, we considered that a reduction in the number of churches was called for, initially, probably to three.

In the last two years things have changed even more dramatically and we are now at a stage where we hope we can start planning for the future and this must involve a review of our parish arrangements.

We have asked the bishop's permission to re-open the discussion about whether or not it would be in the best interest of the Catholics in this area if we operated from two parishes which were identified by the town boundaries rather than the rather odd current boundary which approaches to within a few hundred yards of Christ Church in Nelson town centre.

There are other considerations which have arisen and need to be discussed.

Fr. Gerard and myself would therefore like to invite parishioners to attend a consultation which will be held in Christ Church on the 8th February at 7.00pm. In addition we would welcome written comments either supporting a change of parish boundary or identifying reasons for keeping the current boundary. Written submissions should be received by Fr. Gerard or myself by two weeks after the meeting, the 22nd February.

I have included the letter from the bishop for your information and Fr. Gerard and myself will be speaking to you about the other issues involved.

A Message from Bishop John to the Parishioners of St John Southworth Parish, Nelson and The Good Shepherd Parish, Colne

To be read at all Masses on the weekend of 22 & 23 January 2022

Dear Parishioners,

In March 2020, just prior to the first lockdown, Fr Peter and Fr Gerard wrote to you all inviting you to reflect on the situation of the Catholic Church in Nelson and Colne and the surrounding areas. Over the past two years, I know that they have been co-operating in finding the best ways to serve you, particularly with establishing a new pattern of Masses.

I am writing today to ask you, with your priests, to enter into a short period of consultation on one very specific item. I have been asked to consider re-drawing the boundaries of these two parishes so that the whole of the town of Nelson becomes one parish. This would effectively move Holy Saviour Church from the parish of The Good Shepherd into the parish of St John Southworth.

This proposal was originally flagged up as a possible future option when I published the document on re-organisation of parishes back in January 2017. It would seem that the time is now right to seek your views on this and your priests will outline to you the ways in which you can make those views known to them over the next few weeks, with a view to them submitting a report to me towards the end of February.

In this time of change, let us keep frequently in mind that diocesan prayer, "Stay with us, Lord, on our journey".
