We are happy to make other arrangements for those days.

The Sacred Triduum

The Sacred Triduum is a single Liturgical action which is celebrated in three parts. It celebrates and brings us into the Paschal Mystery of Christ, which is His saving suffering, death and resurrection. It begins with the Last Supper, then gives us the celebration of the Passion and then the Resurrection. These three parts of the single 'action' will be celebrated in Colne at Sacred Heart Church on Maundy Thursday night, the celebration of the Last Supper, 7.00pm.; Good Friday, the Sacred Liturgy of the Lord's Passion, 3.00pm.; and on Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil at 7.00pm.

They will also be celebrated in Nelson by Father Gerard. Maundy Thursday and the Easter Vigil will be at Holy Saviour's and Good Friday will be at Christ Church. Please keep your eye on St. John Southworth newsletter for more information. It is available from the menu on the Good Shepherd website.

These are the most central celebrations of our Catholic Faith so please make a special effort to make them your priority this year either in Nelson or in Colne. God bless, Fr. Peter

Easter Garden

An Easter Garden can take different forms. At Holy Saviour's, there are figures arranged in an Easter scene. At Sacred Heart it will be more symbolic. There will be a path leading from the living waters of Baptism, past the Word of God and symbols of the Eucharist to the empty tomb symbolising our path to the Risen Christ, through the Word of God and the Sacraments of the Church.

Since this is symbolic of our **Life** in Christ, we need your contribution of **living plants** to plant in **our garden**, otherwise the bare, black soil is going to look a bit foolish !!!
