Rev Robert Smith (1922) *see below

*Fr Robert Smith, a Lancashire man, started life as a weaver and struggled hard to educate himself. He became a great Church and Parish builder in Nelson and area, a chief fighter for the Catholic faith, and its chief writer and historian. Appointed by Bishop Bilsbarrow, in 1894, to St Joseph's, whose chapel, at the time," a miserable attic separated from a lumber room," was in the charge of Father Reynders of Colne. Fr Smith, at once set about plans for a commodious new school and church in his own parish, and at the same time engaged in the founding of three new parishes, in Barrowford, Brierfield and Holy Saviour's. As soon as these projects were underway, he set about planning another parish at St George's. In 1906, he acquired the Catholic cemetery of All Souls, for the departed of Colne, Nelson and Brierfield. He died in 1922, and was buried at Dukinfield. RIP.
