Well the results are very clear. For the Vigil Mass, the vast majority were happy with 6pm. A few would have welcomed 6.30pm and a smaller number would have been happy for it to be earlier. For the Sunday Morning Mass: again the majority were in favour of keeping it at as it is, at 9.30am. A few would have preferred it later at 10.00am, but again some would have gone the other way and would have liked it earlier.

The conclusion in this case is clear. There is no great appetite to change the times of either Mass, in fact we keep the vast majority happy by keeping things as they are, and so that is what we will do. Thank you for your responses.

Thank you . . from the SVP



Since the SVP was able to begin work again after Covid, and following our Parish Appeal, we have been very busy, mostly welcoming asylum seekers and refugees in Pendle. Following an appeal to Parishioners we collected so much from donations we were able to open a free 'shop' taking over the ground floor of Holy Saviour's house, Nelson.

Your generosity never ceases to amaze us. We received donations of money, clothes, shoes, towels, bedding, household items, toys, baby equipment, sanitary products, and toiletries, four Silver Cross prams, baby baths, high-chairs, baby gates and five cribs. We opened the 'shop' in November 2021, every Friday from 10.00am – 1pm. So far, we have helped over 210 refugee families set up their homes and lives in this country. Once established, we opened the refugee shop to the poor families as referred to us by three local schools, the homeless via the Salvation Army and the Women's Refuge in Nelson.

The influx of refugees has now slowed down, so we intend to close the refugee shop by the end of June as we have accomplished our aim of providing emergency help for newly settled refugees. We will continue to support the refugees and the poor, by meeting their needs on a case-by-case basis.

We have supplied refugees with bicycles, reconditioned cookers and washing machines, microwaves and hot plates. We have provided seven portable sewing machines to refugee women and hopefully they will be able to start up their own small business amongst the refugee families. We have bought school uniforms for children who have found school places and leisure wear for children newly arrived in the country who had no clothes or coats.

We have also been able to provide emergency aid to refugees and poor families by giving them a £50 food voucher.

We are currently helping some young women who have been trafficked. Providing them with clothes, towels, bedding and £50 each to buy toiletries and sanitary products and food to provide for their needs until they can access benefits.

We have also helped the poor and needy of the local community including providing Christmas presents for 75 poor families, Christmas presents, Easter Eggs and chocolates for the women and children in the Women's Refuge. We also provided a large quantity of clothes and good quality, second hand toys and books for the children in the Refuge. We also gave 5 food gift vouchers each worth £50 to needy families in the Good Shepherd Parish.



Pendle is welcoming refugees from Ukraine over the next few weeks.

Their needs will be different as they are staying with local families, but we have already provided towels, bedding, dressing gowns and a welcome pack of toiletries for the new arrivals.

Yours generosity has meant that we were also able to provide blankets, toiletries, warm jumpers, coats and baby sleeping bags and nappies to be transported to Poland for the refugees sleeping in refugee centres there.

We also purchased 10 double sleeping bags – winter weight and waterproof which would easily accommodate three children or a mother and two children to help them keep warm as they try to sleep in the over crowded railway stations and refugee centres in Poland.



The Good Shepherd SVP would also like to gratefully acknowledge the support of St Joseph's, Barnoldswick SVP, a group of ladies from Settle who also wanted to help the refugees, Trinity Baptist Church in Colne and the parishioners of the Good Shepherd Parish whose generosity seems to have no bounds and who have contributed huge quantities of items for the refugee shop as well as financial donations. We would also like to thank Father Peter Wilkinson our Parish Priest who kindly allowed the SVP to use Holy Saviour's House and who has been so supportive of our work. Also a big thank you to Father Gerard who has been so patient !!
