Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The mission of Jesus was to establish the Kingdom of God in our world so as to lead us into the fullness of God's heavenly Kingdom for all eternity. Jesus promoted the Kingdom of God in two ways: by proclamation and by demonstration. By 'proclamation' we mean his words of teaching, his parables, his discourses and explanations, and all that we find in his sermons and dialogues. By 'demonstration' we refer to the ways in which Jesus brought the power of God into our world and particularly into the lives of those in need of healing, exorcism, reconciliation or conversion. The proclamation and demonstration were brought together in the very person of Jesus, in the example and witness of his life, death, and resurrection.

Natural human goodness points towards this Kingdom-life, but in itself does not have the power or depth to deal with the fundamental human predicament which is that of powerlessness before the mysterious undermining condition which we call sin. It is therefore essential that the Word of the Lord is proclaimed and listened to, and that the regenerative power of the Lord is made known and experienced. This was the desire of Jesus, that he might share his unique relationship with God through which he knew that he was a beloved Son—a son obedient to the word of the Father, and filled with the power of the Holy Spirit.

It is in the Mass that all of the above is presented and celebrated, and although the work of grace is not limited to the Church's liturgical celebrations, it is in the Mass that we most particularly seek God's help, and we, as a Church, most effectively give thanks to God for his loving provision for our every need.

Once again, it is with these thoughts in mind that I intend to celebrate a Mass on Saturday 5th November at 11.00am with the specific intention of inviting and welcoming those who might be encouraged to turn to the Lord in their lives in order that they might listen to his word and receive a new gift of saving and surprising grace. As we want this Mass to be as inclusive as it can be, there will be opportunity to receive personal prayer for specific needs.

In order for this initiative to have its desired effect, we who regularly take our place around the altar of the Lord need to at least desire to play our part as working disciples who actively look out, seek out, and reach out to those whom the Lord wants to touch. If we feel that this is a task beyond our ability, then that itself is our opening to listen to the command of Jesus who tells us that the Holy Spirit will provide us with opportunities to share and words to speak.
