Dear Parishioners and Friends,

People even came crowding in from the towns round about Jerusalem, bringing with them their sick and those tormented by unclean spirits, and all of them were cured (Acts 5:16).

The above verse, taken from the Acts of the Apostles is one of the connecting verses which link the healing ministry of Christ to the healing ministry of the Apostles and the Early Church. The crowds which were once amazed and astonished by the miracles of Jesus are now amazed and astonished by the power at work in the ministry of the Apostles.

This life-giving bond between Jesus and his Church is formed by the Holy Spirit, and is the source of all the Church's power. We can understand thereby that it is not within our human capacity to bring about authentic renewal of the Church. Although it is within our Christian responsibility to do all we can, this is only an expression of our desire that the Lord himself intervenes on our behalf.

The people had belief! They came crowding into Jerusalem because they had high hopes that whatever was happening there was something of tremendous power and value. This observation evokes a first question: "Does my faith fill me with excitement about what amazing transformations the Lord can bring about in our lives?"

The crowds were coming into Jerusalem not just to receive something for themselves! They brought with them those who had all kinds of needs. The second question is this: "If we have come to know Jesus as the source of every blessing, do we do absolutely everything we can to bring others to Jesus?"

"...and all of them were cured."

This is the 'wow factor' of the Gospel. To 'believe' is not to passively await some sort of 'feeling' of piety to well up within us! Belief is a decision to say 'Yes' to the Gospel which we have all heard! Belief leads on to the expectation that the Lord wants to reach out to human beings who are in need, and who are open to receiving his help. Expectation leads on to action—doing something which expresses our expectation! And action leads on to the experience of the Lord at work in miraculous ways through his disciples.

On Saturday, 5th November at 11.00am at Christ Church we will celebrate a Mass in which, as at all Masses, we will celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus. We will include, in this Mass, prayers for healing. Everyone is welcome, everybody should consider themselves invited! Maybe you know that you should be inviting others, or maybe you know you are in need of the healing touch of the Lord. Where is your place in all that you read above?
