Dear Parishioners and Friends,

On this Third Sunday of Lent, in Year A, we are invited to listen in to the intimate dialogue between Jesus and the Samaritan woman, as presented to us in John's Gospel. In the context of Lent, this story can be understood as a prompt to enter more deeply into our own hearts that we may identify more clearly our own motivations and desires. The Samaritan woman has sought solace in a series of relationships, and Jesus sees she is now ready to look deeper into her heart to find the evasive security for which she is seeking.

Although we have a whole host of physical and emotional needs which make themselves known to us, we also have spiritual appetites which long to be fulfilled. Our spiritual needs may not present themselves to us with the same immediacy as other needs, but they are the enduring needs of our lives and ultimately express our most basic need for God. It is when we are deprived of other satisfactions, either through circumstance or through choice, that we are more open to experience something beyond the incessant push and pulls of our daily lives. The woman found a few moments to listen to Jesus—a few moments which changed her life! Can we find a few moments to be with Jesus, and allow him to guide our hearts to drink from the life-giving wells of divine refreshment?

May our Lenten exercises attract the Lord's Lenten blessings! Fr Gerard.
