As from the Third Sunday of Advent, (Saturday Vigil 16th December) we will once again be using the collection baskets during the Offertory at the Vigil Mass and Sunday Mass.

But for everyone else, we are aware that the bucket is easily missed and we would hate anyone to feel that they had not been given the opportunity to contribute to the parish.



I am delighted to reproduce here Father Gerard's letter to his parishioners from his newsletter this week. He expresses what I would like to say much more eloquently and clearly than I would be able to do, what I would like to say.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The Parish Mission at Sacred Heart church, which concluded with a final Mission Service on Friday

evening, was for me an unexpected grace. It would seem to be the very nature of grace, that it is

always unexpected; when we are looking for one thing, we find something else which is more valuable

than what we were first looking for!

The Mission which was a great opportunity for the people of Sacred Heart parish in Colne, became an

unplanned and unexpected blessing to all our parishioners living in Nelson, Brierfield, Fence, and to folk

who came along from even further afield. We thank Fr Peter and the parishioners of Sacred Heart

parish for extending their welcome to us! It was truly a delightful spiritual experience which served to

nurture our Advent preparation for Christmas.

We prayed for healing for ourselves in every aspect of our lives; we were presented with opportunities

to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation; we prayed for those who have died; we reflected on the

great gift of prayer which opens us to the power of God, and finally, on Friday evening, we renewed our

devotion to Mary, the mother of Jesus.

We thank the two Redemptorist priests—Fr Peter and Fr Elias—who preached with passion, and who

presented their message in creative liturgies which helped us to really enter into the times of prayer

and reflection.

But, what was for me an unexpected grace was how comfortable we all felt ourselves to be as we

gathered together from the wider area of Pendle. If you would care to listen to the debate to which

there is a link at the bottom of this page, you will hear about how the Holy Spirit is at work in new ways

in the Church, and it would seem to be clear that parish life as we have experienced it over this last fifty

years is changing. Just as our natural families tend to be more dispersed than in times past, we are now

experiencing a widening of our spiritual family beyond the geographical boundaries which once very

much defined a parish.

Last week's Parish Mission was a shared experience, creating a shared memory, and this, after all, is

what the life of the Church is all about: a shared experience and a shared memory which takes us all the

way back to the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus, and that first experience of the power of the
