#### What is the vision of the Parish of the Good Shepherd in Pendle?

We can be sure that the Holy Spirit is speaking to us!

It is within the body of the Baptised Faithful that the guidance of the Holy Spirit lives and moves. It is the function of the Pope and Bishops to hear the voice of God in the Sacred Scriptures, especially the Word of God - Jesus Christ - speaking through the Gospels, but it is also absolutely essential that they also listen to the Wisdom which the Holy Spirit cultivates in the prayerful reflections of the Faithful members of the Church. History shows us that there are times when the leadership of the hierarchy has been questionable. We all know the horror stories of bad popes and horrendous leadership by bishops in the Middle Ages etc. It is the Faith of the People of God which has sustained the Church and ensured that "the gates of Hell will never prevail against it." Mt 16:18 Pope Francis has invited us all to listen to each other in a prayerful and charitable atmosphere and to discover if there is a voice of the Holy Spirit emerging which we have not been attentive to. This process is extended to every parish and group of the Faithful.

How can we participate in this process in this parish?

We are currently in 'The Big Listen' stage, where you are encouraged to get involved by attending a Parish Listening Session. In our parish, these sessions have been planned for 3 dates in January - Wednesday 17th after morning Mass, Thursday 18th after the 6.30pm evening Mass and after the Sunday Mass on 21st January. The meetings will be in the Sts Peter and Paul meeting room in the presbytery (through the sacristy and down the stairs).

These will NOT be discussion sessions, but opportunities for each person to have their voice heard and their thoughts recorded - if they wish - and submitted to the diocese. It will then be the job of the collators in the diocese to see if there are any common themes emerging. We will then have to reflect, prayerfully, to discover what the Holy Spirit is saying to us and what to do about it.
