Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread (Luke 24:35).

A disciple wants to do what disciples do! In this weekend's Resurrection Gospel we see the disciples telling their story of what had happened on the road. The 'road' can be understood as the road of life along which we are all travelling. It's on this road that we come to meet Jesus. In the case of the disciples on the road to Emmaus, they recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

For St Augustine, it was not until his later years that he looked back and recognised that the Lord had been speaking to him through his mother! As a young man he hadn't recognised the voice of wisdom and had been unable to find his way in life.

We are invited to reflect on how we have met Jesus on the road... in a moment of forgiveness, in a moment of healing, in a moment of experiencing Jesus' guidance or provision. As disciples of Jesus we are then called to tell our story to others. Our story then helps others to recognise Jesus as he meets them on their journeys. May the blessings of Easter fill our hearts with love and joy. Fr Gerard.

Communion under both kinds

The Church teaches that the fullness of Christ, i.e. his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity is present in the Sacred Host. The fullness of the sacramental sign, however, as given to us by Jesus, includes both the eating of the Body and drinking of the Blood. The sacramental signs are the human realities which draw us into the spiritual realities, opening up our hearts to the reception of grace and then to the experience of the effects of grace in our lives.

As we should always aspire towards best liturgical practice, albeit taking other considerations into account, I think it is now reasonable to re-introduce the Communion chalice by first of all making it available at daily Masses which are more manageable than the fuller congregations on Sundays.
