Prayer and Discussion Group Tuesday 18th June The Rosary - Why?

There will be a discussion and prayers at 7pm to 8 pm in the St. Peter and Paul's Room in the Presbytery.

How did the Rosary start? What developed it as a popular devotion? Is there only one type of Rosary in use? Have there been changes in its content? How recent was the last change? What should you think about during the Rosary? Is it a meditation or a mantra, or both? Is there a connection between the words of the prayers and the Mysteries to be celebrated? Do you have to say it slowly and think about every word? Is it wrong to say it quickly and 'day dream' through it? What questions do you have? How does it work for you? Come along and share your thoughts and experiences or listen to those of others.

Day for Life collection 15 and 16 June

There will be a collection next weekend.

The theme for this year is:

The Lord is my Shepherd - Compassion and Hope at the End of Life.

June is the month of the Sacred Heart.

During the month of June we are invited to consider the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The 'modern' devotion to the Sacred Heart goes back to a French nun named Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque who began experiencing visions of the Sacred Heart in 1673. Those visions continued for 18 months. During her visions, Sister Margaret Mary learned ways to venerate the Sacred Heart of Christ. These devotions included the concept of a Holy Hour on Thursdays, the creation of the feast of the Sacred Heart after Corpus Christi, and the reception of the Eucharist on the first Friday of every month.



We commemorate these visions with the mosaic in the Sacred Heart chapel next to the sacristy door in Sacred Heart church. Perhaps you might want to consider spending a moment looking at that mosaic, or at the stained glass window in the sanctuary and consider the Love of Jesus which the image portrays. We see a heart, burning with love, but a heart which is pierced and which has bled for us, a heart which is wrapped in a crown of thorns, which has suffered for us and a heart which is surmounted by a cross, a heart that has died for us.

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us.
