

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The boy Jesus had an inkling that life was more mysterious than he had yet come to fully realise. He told his concerned parents that he must be busy with his Father's affairs. So, Jesus was to be found down at the Temple, "sitting among the doctors, listening to them and asking them questions." It would be many years later that Jesus would come to a full realisation of who he was called to be, and what he was called to do.

I'm reminded of St Paul who writes to the Corinthians, "When I was a child, I used to talk like a child, and think like a child, and argue like a child, but now I am a man, all childish ways are put behind me." St Paul, too, like Jesus, matured in his sense of self-identity and purpose." Just as with Jesus, Paul came to the overwhelming sense that he was called and chosen, and that he had an important mission to accomplish in his life.

The Baptism of the Lord marks that defining moment when Jesus, emerging from the waters of the Jordan, is now fully aware and empowered to take up, and live from, the fullness of his spiritual identity as revealed to him by the Father: "You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you."

We can understand from these stories presented to us in the Scriptures that full Christian maturity takes us beyond simply human maturity. Of course, we need to grow up and take responsibility for our lives and try to make a contribution to our world like every human person. But, beyond all this, our baptism imparts to us a spiritual calling to share in the life of Jesus himself. This calling takes us beyond our natural human capacities and enables us to find a new home in the realms of faith. It is from this place—of a faith that is coming to maturity—that we experience the call of Christ, the security of the Father's love, and the empowerment of the Spirit.



It is from the ministry of Jesus that Christian community and parish life was first brought into being, and it's from the continuing presence of the gift of the Holy Spirit, who is given to each of us in baptism, that parish life can flourish and develop. My prayer is that as a parish community we can, each of us, grow beyond self-interest, and come to that maturity of faith which calls us to take responsibility, not only for ourselves, but for all our brothers and sisters in our parish family.


