Unrolling the Scroll and Beginning to Read

Dear Parishioners and Friends,



Imagine picking up a book, and as you read the first few pages, you begin to realise it is all about YOU! Not only are you surprised that someone seems to know all about you, but, beyond that, the author knows things about you that you did not even know yourself!

This was the experience of Jesus as he unrolled the scroll of the prophet Isaiah and began to read. The ancient writing foretold the coming of the Messiah. 'Messiah' is the Hebrew word for the 'Anointed One'; or in Greek, the 'Christos'; or in English, the 'Christ'. Jesus saw a clear reflection of himself, shining through the prophetic words of Isaiah, just as we might see a reflection of ourselves in a mirror.

Maybe Jesus himself was taken by surprise on that day as the Word of God jolted him into a full realisation of his true identity, and beyond that, the mission laid out before him: a mission of proclamation, healing, and liberation.

It is no wonder that Jesus, having read aloud these few lines, would roll up the scroll, give it back to the attendant and sit down. He must have been in a state of shock as he realised that, from this day forward, life would never be the same again. Here in Nazareth, his hometown, he was no longer to be claimed by his family and townsfolk as the familiar son of the carpenter. The story of Jesus, written by the prophet, was taking a new turn and unfolding into an astonishing drama!

Jesus, in a state of surrender to what he has read and understood, can only speak out from his now certain conviction that, 'Today, this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.'

This glimpse into the vocation of Jesus sheds light on how we too can come to an understanding of who we are and what we are called to be and to do. We have a sense of overwhelming privilege that God himself knows us personally and intimately—better than we can know ourselves! On the other hand, we are humbled to the core of our being in that what God is asking of us goes far beyond our abilities. Our attitude can only be one of surrender.

In Baptism and Confirmation, we too become Anointed Ones, not in our own right, but anointed to share in the life of Jesus. There is no genuine vocation that takes us away from a single-minded and single-hearted devotion to Jesus and his mission. And on every day, even today itself, we can recognise that we too have our part to play in the unfolding of God's plans for the world. Do we dare to unroll the scroll and live by the script that has been written especially for us?
