## **Advent Reflection**

During the Season of Advent, we reflect on the three comings of Christ. The first coming was the birth of Jesus as the fulfilment of Old Testament prophecy—Jesus born of the Virgin and heralded by shepherds and angels.

The 'second coming' refers to the return of Christ at the end of time when he will come again, not in the weakness of human flesh but as the risen and glorified Christ—the Lord of heaven and of earth.

The third coming of Christ refers to the appearance of Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit, in the lives of those who welcome him into their hearts.

The first coming of Christ we remember as an event in human history. The second coming of Christ we look forward to as the fulfilment of a promise. The third coming of Christ we celebrate as a personal, spiritual, and lived reality.

The first coming of Christ provides a solid basis for our faith; the second coming is the focus of our hope, and the third coming is the source of our power to overcome our human limitations, and to experience the love of God himself at work within our personal lives and in all our relationships.

It's this third coming of Christ that ignites our spiritual lives as we allow Jesus to take up his place at the centre of our hearts, in such a way, that we can experience his intimate presence within us. As St Augustine wrote, all those years go, "Our hearts are restless, Lord, until they find their rest in you."

The first coming of Christ was according to the will and timing of God; the second coming is promised, but "at an hour we do not expect!" The third coming of Christ is the only coming in which we have our part to play; the Lord is always knocking at the doors of our hearts, but we can be hesitant in responding to his insistent request to be allowed to enter in.

During this time of Advent we are invited to turn down some of the 'noise' in our lives. We don't have the luxury of being able to step out of our daily routines, but we can use every quiet moment to ask Jesus to come closer to us; to make his home with us, and to make all that we do a prayer.

Let's not be afraid to carve out some time and space in our busy schedules in order to invite Jesus to come and take up residence within us. Just think how the first coming of Christ changed the world forever! And then just ponder on how Christ can change our own personal world in new and surprising ways.

May we who enter seriously into the preparation Season of Advent be rewarded with a 'seriously joyful' Christmas celebration!
