Carlo Acutis, a London-born teenager, was declared a saint on Sunday 7th September 2025. He is the first Saint of the millennial generation. Born in 1991 and growing up in Milan, Italy, Carlo died in 2006 at the age of 15 due to leukaemia. His life, though short, was marked by a profound faith and a passion for technology, which he used to spread the teachings of the Catholic Church.

God is still in the business of making Saints, and the Church is still in the business of recognising them to be such! The Saints remind us that we all have a personal mission to grow towards the fullness of holiness, and Carlo reminds us that God can bring us a long way in a short period of time if our devotion to Jesus and his Church is single minded.

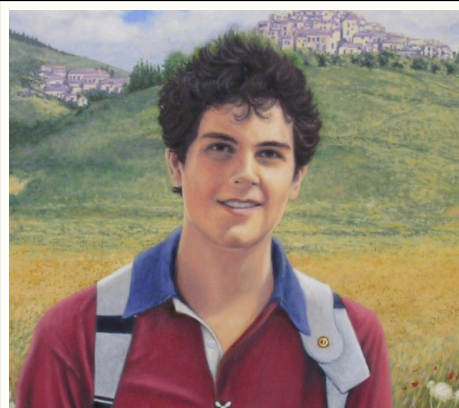

Relics of St Carlo Acutis to Visit Diocese of Salford - January 2026

This month, the relics of St Carlo Acutis will be hosted at two churches in our diocese over five days, during which time schools, parishioners, and people from all over will be welcome to come and venerate. Carlo is the first millennial Saint, and is celebrated for his profound faith and his use of the internet to log Eucharistic miracles from around the world. He was passionate about spreading the teachings of the Catholic Church up until his death from leukaemia

at the age of 15. The relics will be presented at St Mary's Church, Burnley from 28-29 January 2026 before they travel to St Patrick's Church, Collyhurst from 30 January to 1 February 2026.
